Held, by the Court of Appeal, that the usual agency terms being that the agent should be repaid his disbursements and receive, not half the profits, but half the profit charges, whether they were paid by the client or not, he was entitled to nothing more, and could not claim to participate in the interest; for that, although his suspending his right to payment would have made a stipulation for interest reasonable, the Court could not import such a stipulation.
